DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"It's about one moment, that moment you think you know where you stand And in that one moment the things that you're sure of slip from your hand And you've got one second to try to be clear, to try to stand tall But nothing's the same and the wind starts to blow..."

For those who are unfamiliar, *Songs for a New World* is not your typical musical. It doesn't have a linear plot or consistent characters, and on the surface, it may appear more like a concert than a traditional show. Composer, Jason Robert Brown, describes it as a theatrical song cycle, a series of discrete vignettes united by a common theme: the decision point. Every song in our show is a window into a different world, where characters across time and place are each struggling with choices that have the potential to define their lives. Each option they face opens up a "new world" of possibilities, sparked by the dream of hope or shrouded by the fear of regret.

Some characters are in the midst of making a decision; The captain of a sailing ship crossing the Atlantic tries his best to keep his crew and passengers safe during their long journey; A young woman who discovers she is pregnant on Christmas Eve grapples with her feelings, comparing her emotional journey to that of the Virgin Mary; Two lovers on the wrong side of a breakup share their feelings and decide whether or not to give their love another try.

Some characters are looking to the future and the decisions that lay in their path; An Upper East Side housewife threatens to jump off a building if she doesn't get the attention she's missing from her husband; A young basketball player juxtaposes his difficult upbringing against his goals to become an NBA star; Betsy Ross turns sewing her iconic flag into an exercise in hope and fear as she prays for the safe return of her loved ones who are out fighting for American Independence.

Other characters are looking back on decisions they made that shaped their lives for better or worse: A woman who prioritized an extravagant lifestyle over passion and love wonders whether what she gained is worth what she lost; A man looks back on his failed relationships, comparing his journey in love to his father's successes and failures running a store; A prisoner reflects on the injustice of his wrongful imprisonment, wondering whether or not his dreams can still come true or if his story has already been written.

Each of these stories may seem to have nothing in common, but as the show progresses, themes begin to appear, and patterns emerge. When planning our future, should we prioritize love or security? When the safety or happiness of others lies in our hands, how do we deal with that responsibility? Does your past define you or can you rise above your circumstances? What does it feel like when we reach a fork in the road and don't know where to turn?

As you watch our production of *Songs for a New World*, you may find yourself connecting the dots as these themes are explored, or you may just sit back and enjoy an evening of beautiful songs. Either way, the students of the Pascack Hills Players have put their hearts and souls into learning this challenging music, exploring these various characters, learning unique, contemporary choreography, and designing sets, costumes, and lighting to unite these varied stories into one, cohesive vision. The team and I would like to thank them for their hard work throughout this unusual process, and for always being on board for a new challenge.

Select professional theatre directing credits include Vis Major (Treehouse Theater), Maude Goes to Sleep (Luna Stage), Mallory/Valerie (The Living Theater, NY International Fringe Festival), Reefer Madness (Montclair State University Players), and Hair (Montclair State University Players). Film directing credits include Late for Brunch (2018, Winner Top Shorts Film Festival, Indie Street Film Festival), Toss-Up (2019, Hoboken International Film Festival, New York Shorts International Film Festival, Golden Door International Film Festival, Garden State Film Festival), the blue light stays on (2021, Winner Best Female Filmmaker Garden State Film Festival, Reale Film Festival, Big Apple Film Festival), and Alan Builds A Fire (postproduction). She is thrilled to be back in person in the auditorium and would like to thank her students and production team for all their hard work, and the administration at Hills for their unwavering support.

NICOLE D'ANGELO (MUSIC DIRECTOR) - Nicole D'Angelo (she/they) is a music director, actor, and multi-instrumentalist who works in NJ and NY.
